January 28, 1999, marks the 146th birthday of José Julián Martí—Cuba's greatest hero, poet, statesman, and democratic revolutionary. Considered the apostle of Cuban independence, Martí published many writings advocating independence from Spain. Even at the age of 15, he was arrested for writing letters against Spanish rule. Martí wrote, "Liberty is the right of every man to be honest, to think, and to speak without hypocrisy." He ultimately died fighting for Cuban independence in a battle with Spanish troops in Dos Ríos, Cuba at the young age of 42.

Although trained as a lawyer, Martí devoted much of his energy to writing and teaching. He was the precursor of "modernismo" in Spanish letters and noted for his simple, fluent style and vivid imagery. Martí was a firm believer in public education and was a teacher in Venezuela, Guatemala, and New York. He declared that, "Education is like a tree; the seed is sown, and it opens out into many branches." Martí's life will ever remain a testament to the lives of all men and women who live by great ethical and moral values and standards. As School Board Members, we must strive to instill these essential character traits in our children. Martí wrote, "It is necessary to make virtue fashionable." As elected officials representing the best interests of children, we must help to make this so.

WHEREAS, José Martí was a man of genius, imagination, hope, and courage and gave all for his principles without thinking of any selfish return for himself;
