**SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT FUNDS FROM AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH THE JOBS AND EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP REGIONAL BOARD AND THE TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT COUNCIL OF SOUTH FLORIDA FOR FUNDING AS A ONE-STOP CAREER SERVICE CENTER OPERATOR AND ELIGIBLE TRAINING PROVIDER, AUGUST 1, 1999 – JUNE 30, 2000**

**STRATEGIC PLANNING GOAL: II - STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT/PREPARATION FOR POST-SECONDARY EXPERIENCES**

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) of 1998 and Florida Senate Bill 1566 of 1999, require that state and local workforce development efforts be concentrated in the following four strategic areas: (1) Youth Programs, (2) Welfare to Work, (3) High Skills/High Wages, and (4) One-Stop Career Centers.

The Jobs and Education Partnership (JEP) and Training and Employment Council (TEC) of South Florida approved funding for Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) in the amount of \$718,000 as follows:

- **One-Stop Career Centers**  
Funding, in the amount of \$592,000, will cover partial costs to establish One-Stop Career Centers at Robert Morgan Vocational Institute, The English Center, South Dade Skills Center, and Miami Skill Center. The primary emphasis of the One-Stop Career Center is to offer employment information, assessment, and job placement for targeted populations including veterans, youths aged 18-21, dislocated workers, individuals with disabilities, and farm workers.
- **Individual Training Accounts (ITAs)**  
The WIA specifies that all Title I adult and dislocated worker training services shall be funded through the use of ITAs, which make it possible to access approved training programs provided by "eligible training providers." As an eligible training provider, M-DCPS will use funds, in the amount of \$126,000, to cover training costs such as fees, books, supplies, and uniforms.

The contractual agreement with JEP/TEC of South Florida authorizes M-DCPS as a One-Stop Career Service Operator. Under WIA, adult education, literacy and youth programs, and post-secondary vocational education programs are mandated components of the One-Stop system. The contract was authorized at the JEP/TEC of South Florida Board meeting July 26, 1999.

District Workforce Development funds in the amount of \$1,084,000 will be required to supplement funds received from JEP/TEC of South Florida. The appropriation for this item will be included under Fund 0100, Object 5150, Program 6290, Function 5338, Location 9905, in the General Fund of the 1999-2000 Tentative Budget.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept funds from and to enter into a contractual agreement with the Jobs and Education Partnership Regional Board and the Training and Employment Council of South Florida, in the amount of \$718,000, for funding as a One-Stop Career Service Operator and Eligible Training Provider, August 1, 1999 – June 30, 2000; and
2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
