BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Business & Education Alliances (OBEA), issued a Request for Proposals for the 1999-00 school year to establish or continue local school and business partnership efforts at the high school level with funding from the Florida Compact Program.

During the 1997-98 and 1998-99 school years, the Academy of Travel and Tourism (AOTT) Magnet Program at Miami Springs Senior High School implemented a project entitled Hospitality School-to-Career Transition Satellite Center Initiative. This project enabled students to participate in on-the-job training internships, facilitated by Miami International Airport Hotel, in various careers in the hospitality industry. During the 1999-00 school year, the AOTT will continue this project, renamed the Hawk Academy, which will further the partnership with the Miami International Airport Hotel and the Miami International Airport, and will continue to provide on-the-job internships and career opportunities.

Authorization is being requested for the Miami-Dade County Public Schools to enter into a contractual agreement with Ombudsman Educational Services, in the amount of \$30,000, to continue to provide educational services to Academy students. During the 1998-99 school year, this project was funded in the amount of \$30,000 for contractual services with Ombudsman Educational Services.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, Office of Business & Education Alliances, Florida Compact Program, in the amount of \$30,000, for funding the Hawk Academy Project and to enter into a contractual agreement, in the amount of \$30,000, with Ombudsman Educational Services, July 1, 1999 June 30, 2000; and
- Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
