**SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION UNDER THE CARL D. PERKINS VOCATIONAL AND APPLIED TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION ACT FOR FUNDING THE INTEGRATING APPLIED TECHNOLOGY GRANT, SEPTEMBER 1, 1999 – SEPTEMBER 30, 2000**

The Florida Department of Education requested proposals to continue funding the established Applied Technology programs within each of the six Area Centers for Educational Enhancement throughout the state. The Bureau of Elementary, Secondary, and Workforce Development Education received a grant award under this initiative. Included in the grant award is funding for one educational specialist who will provide staff development focused on implementing the applied technology initiatives and disseminating information on how to use Florida's Applied Technology Companion for the Sunshine State Standards, *Preparing All Learners for Tomorrow's Work Force*.

Funds, in the amount of \$100,000, will be used to cover salaries, contracted services, travel, materials, supplies and equipment.

No local funds are required.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$100,000, under the Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Education Act for funding the Integrating Applied Technology Grant, September 1, 1999 – September 30, 2000; and
2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
