**SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH THE MIAMI-DADE/MONROE WORK AND GAIN ECONOMIC SELF-SUFFICIENCY (WAGES) COALITION FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE COMMUNITY WORK EXPERIENCE FOR 300 WAGES PARTICIPANTS, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$100,000, FROM JANUARY 13, 2000 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2000**

**STRATEGIC PLANNING GOALS: II - STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT/PREPARATION FOR POST SECONDARY EXPERIENCES  
IX - COMMUNITY/HOME/PARENT/SCHOOL/BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS**

Authorization is requested to enter into a contractual agreement with the Miami-Dade/Monroe Work and Gain Economic Self-Sufficiency (WAGES) Coalition to provide subsidized community work experience at public school and other community sites to WAGES customers. Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) will place individuals who are receiving welfare benefits in non-paid positions, classifying them as M-DCPS adult work experience students within the WAGES intensive services program operated by M-DCPS. Through the program, participants will have the opportunity to acquire the knowledge and skills needed to perform their assigned jobs.

The WAGES Coalition will pay M-DCPS a fee of \$100,000 to administer the community work experience activities for 300 persons. No current M-DCPS employee shall be displaced by a trainee, including no partial displacement such as reduction in wages, hours of non-overtime work, or employment benefits.

Mr. Milton Vickers is the Executive Director of the Miami-Dade/Monroe WAGES Coalition.

No local funds are required.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to enter into a contractual agreement with the Miami-Dade/Monroe Work and Gain Economic Self-Sufficiency (WAGES) Coalition for Miami-Dade County Public Schools to provide community work experience for 300 WAGES participants, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000, from January 13, 2000 through June 30, 2000.

No local funds are required.
