**SUBJECT: SAFETY AND SANITATION STANDARDS AND INSPECTION OF  
PROPERTY DEFICIENCIES – FIRE SAFETY VIOLATIONS**

The school district is responsible for creating a climate in the schools that ensures the safety and welfare of all students and personnel. It is critical that every site administrator comply with Florida Statutes, Section 235.06 – Safety and Sanitation Standards and Inspection of Property and Section 231.085 – Duties of Principals, to ensure the safety and health of occupants of educational and ancillary plants. Therefore, it is proposed that the Superintendent direct administrators to include implementation of all safety procedures in the School Site Administrator Performance Planning and Assessment System.

To accomplish this goal, it is recommended that deficiencies stemming from Florida Statutes, Section 235.06 be included as job targets in the School Site Administrator Planning and Assessment System during the Planning Phase, addressing specific worksite needs and objectives. The job targets, Florida Principal Competencies, and the Miami-Dade County Public Schools Technical Skills will be monitored at the Progress Phase and subsequently evaluated each year.

It is further recommended that not meeting performance standards in any of these identified competencies, technical skills, and/or job targets may lead to the issuance of a Performance Improvement Plan as delineated in the MANUAL PROCEDURES FOR MANAGERIAL EXEMPT PERSONNEL, Section C – School Site Administrator Performance Planning and Assessment System.
