**SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING UNDER TITLE VI – INNOVATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM STRATEGIES, IMPROVING AMERICA'S SCHOOLS ACT, JULY 1, 2000 – JUNE 30, 2001**

On October 24, 1994, Congress enacted the Improving America's Schools Act, which authorizes funding for Title VI Innovative Education Program Strategies. The 1999-2000 allocation of Title VI funds for the Miami-Dade County Public Schools was \$2,922,316, including 258,260 in roll-forward funds. The 2000-2001 allocation of Title VI funds is \$2,488,487. It is anticipated that an additional \$350,000 in roll-forward funds will also be available, for a total allocation of \$2,838,487.

Title VI provides federal through state financial assistance to each school district based upon the following:

- the percentage of students enrolled in public schools, as well as in participating private non-profit schools; and
- the percentage of children from low-income families.

The targeted program areas for Title VI are:

- Technology Programs
- Instructional and Educational Materials tied to High Academic Standards
- Programs for Education Reform and Magnet Schools
- Programs to Improve Higher Order Thinking Skills of Disadvantaged Students
- Programs to Combat Illiteracy
- Programs for Gifted and Talented Students
- School Reform Programs Consistent with Goals 2000: Educate America Act
- Planning, designing and initial implementation of charter schools
- School Improvement Programs for Title I-Funded Projects

Title VI funds support district priority programs in the regions, feeder patterns and central offices. Funds are used for personnel, equipment, supplies, materials, printing, duplication and pupil transportation.

No local funds are required.

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RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$2,838,487, for funding under Title VI-Innovative Education Program Strategies, Improving America's Schools Act, July 1, 2000 – June 30, 2001; and
2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
