In 1915, National Black History Theme Month was initiated by Harvard-trained historian Dr. Carter G. Woodson as a week-long observance, and it was expanded to the entire month of February in 1976, in conjunction with the 200th birthday of the United States. This annual celebration prompts our diverse community to recognize and celebrate the many cultural, social, spiritual, and economic contributions of African-Americans to the United States.

Each year the theme for Black History Month is selected by The Association for the Study of African-American Life and History, Inc., founded by Dr. Woodson. This year's theme is "Creating and defining the African-American community, family, church, politics, and culture." Curriculum materials and speakers related to the theme are available through the Black Archives History and Research Foundation of South Florida, Inc.

Approval of the resolution that accompanies this item will support the implementation of the African-American history legislation required by the State of Florida and by Miami-Dade County Public Schools' policy.

This item does not appear in the regular agenda. There is good cause to vary from the agenda because of the need to have the resolution authorized by the Board prior to February 2001.
