SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT TWO GRANT

AWARDS FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING THE NEW MILLENNIUM HIGH SCHOOLS PROJECTS;

PROJECT CYCLE: OCTOBER 2, 2000 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2001

In 1999, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) issued a Request for Proposals to promote the implementation of the Florida Tech Prep Pathway (FTPP) Certificate Program in ten high schools in the state. William H. Turner Technical Arts High School was one of the centers chosen through a competitive process to receive the New Millennium High Schools grant.

In 2000, the FDOE issued two Requests for Proposals to continue to promote the implementation of the FTPP. The first of the proposals was to promote the implementation of FTPP in ten additional high schools in the state, and the second proposal was to promote continued implementation of FTPP in the initial pilot sites that were selected in 1999. Miami Lakes Educational Center has been selected through a competitive process to receive the New Millennium High Schools grant and William H. Turner Technical Arts High School has been selected to receive the New Millennium High Schools continuation grant.

Graduates who earn the FTPP certificate are well-prepared to continue their education in post secondary institutions, while also possessing skills, knowledge, and attitudes which ensure success in today's technologically competitive workforce. Issuance of the certificate requires attainment of high academic standards in conjunction with career preparation. The latter requisites involve completing an industry-certified technical program and core technology course of study, taking part in a four-year career guidance program, participating in a work-based learning experience, and articulating with post secondary institutions of learning.

Funds granted to Miami Lakes Educational Center, in the amount of \$150,000, will be used for salaries, travel, professional development, instructional materials, supplies, printing, and software. Funds granted to William H. Turner Technical Arts High School, in the amount of \$50,000, will be used for salaries, textbooks, supplies, software, and travel.

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Official notification relative to this grant award was received on January 3, 2001. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from October 2, 2000.

No local funds are required.

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## RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- accept two grant awards from the Florida Department of Education, in the total amount of \$200,000, for funding the New Millennium High Schools Projects; Project Cycle: October 2, 2000 through June 30, 2001;
- extend this grant award, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary in order to fully expend the grant award and thus complete the scope of the project; and
- 3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
