SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION UNDER THE COMMUNITY/HIGHER EDUCATION/SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP FOR FUNDING THE INTERGENERATIONAL COMMUNITY STUDIES ORAL HISTORY PROGRAM; PROJECT CYCLE: JANUARY 1, 2001 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 2001

The Bureau of Community Education developed and submitted a grant application to the Florida Department of Education for funding under the Community/Higher Education/School Partnership (CHESP) program to fund the Intergenerational Community Studies Oral History Program. The program is designed to enhance all subjects in the high school curriculum by retrieving the wealth of knowledge embedded in the memories of people living in the community. The program will involve teams of Miami-Dade County students and teachers, in collaboration with University of Miami students and professors, in an innovative program which pairs the teams with mentors skilled in gathering and video taping oral histories of community elders.

Grant funds in the amount of \$29,403 will be used to provide substitutes, hourly personnel, pupil transportation, printing, and supplies.

The Florida Department of Education has provided Miami-Dade County Public Schools written notification that the project has been funded; the official grant award is forthcoming. The budget period for the grant award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures beginning January 1, 2001.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$29,403, under the Community/Higher Education/School Partnership, for funding the Intergenerational Community Studies Oral History Program; January 1, 2001 through August 31, 2001;
2. extend this grant award, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to fully expend the grant award and thus complete the scope of the project; and
3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
