## SUBJECT: EMPLOYEE RESIGNATION

At the School Board meeting of April 18, 2001, The School Board approved revised Agenda Item E-1 and accepted the resignation of Julio Garrido, effective June 2, 2001.

On May 31, 2001, the employee obtained a court order in the Circuit Court of the 11<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit in and for Miami-Dade County, Florida, Case No. 00-17513. Said Order granted the employee's motion to correct a scrivener's error in the effective date of employee's resignation from June <u>2</u>, 2001 to June <u>22</u>, 2001. (Emphasis supplied).

The School Board was not represented at the hearing on the employee's motion, thus the Court was not aware that the School Board had already acted upon the employee's resignation and its effective date. The School Board could petition the Court to reconsider its ruling; however administration and the Board Attorney's Office recommend complying with the provisions of the Court's Order, thus rescinding the previous resignation and accepting the resignation, effective June 22, 2001

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida rescind the June 2, 2001 resignation of Julio Garrido and accept Mr. Garrido's resignation, effective June 22, 2001.
