**SUBJECT: RENEW BID NO. 281-XX02 - UNDERGROUND PETROLEUM
STORAGE TANKS: REMOVAL AND CLEAN UP**

The purpose of this bid, opened on July 27, 1999, was to establish a contract, to purchase, at firm unit prices, quantities, as may be required, of removal and clean up of underground storage tanks, for the Department of Safety, Environment and Hazards Management. The terms of agreement, as contained in the subject bid, awarded by the Board on October 20, 1999, and re-awarded on March 15, 2000, provided, that by mutual agreement between the successful vendors and The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, the contract may be renewed for two (2) additional one (1) year periods. The contract is currently in its initial two-year period. The awardees have agreed to renew for the first one (1) year renewal period, for all items awarded, by letter, on file. It is considered to be in the best interest of the Board to renew this bid, for an additional one (1) year period, at the current prices, to benefit from fixed prices, during the next twelve (12) months, inasmuch as the Consumer Price Index (CPI), as of March 2001, indicated an increase of 2.9%.
