SUBJECT: THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA v. CHARLIE L. BRADLEY - DOAH CASE NO. 99-5005

On November 17, 1999, the School Board took action to terminate Respondent Charlie L. Bradley from his position as teacher at Mays Middle School with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for unsatisfactory performance and gross insubordination. A Final Hearing was held on January 31 through February 1, 2001, by video teleconference, before J.D. Parrish, a designated Administrative Law Judge of the Division of Administrative Hearings. On June 5, 2001, the Administrative Law Judge entered a Recommended Order affirming the School Board's termination of Respondent for unsatisfactory performance and gross insubordination.

Respondent's exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order were due on June 20, 2001. On June 18, 2001, Respondent filed a motion for extension of time. In his motion, Respondent requested a 15-day extension of time to file exceptions. In order to avoid any further delay in rendition of a Final Order, it is recommended that a 15-day extension of time be granted. If a 15-day extension of time is granted, Respondent's exceptions were due as of July 5, 2001.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida grant the Respondent a 15-day extension of time to file exceptions to the Administrative law Judge's Recommended Order in The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida v. Charlie L. Bradley, DOAH Case No. 99-5005, up to and including July 5, 2001.
