**SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING UNDER THE IMPROVING AMERICA'S SCHOOLS ACT, 1994, TITLE II EISENHOWER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM; PROJECT CYCLE: JULY 12, 2001 THROUGH JULY 31, 2002**

Under the Improving America's School Act of 1994, Title II was reauthorized as the Eisenhower Professional Development Program (EPDP) for the purpose of providing teacher education programs designed to improve teaching and learning in the areas of mathematics and science. In addition to the priority areas of mathematics and science, the Florida Department of Education received a waiver that permits EPDP funds to be expended in the other core academic subject areas, i.e., social studies, foreign languages, and language arts. The Office of Human Resources and Development has prepared an application for the 2001-2002 school year to be used for:

1. teacher education in the core curriculum areas of mathematics, science, language arts, foreign languages, and social studies to improve the teaching and learning of all students;
2. professional development and recruitment activities to increase the number of teachers from under-represented groups teaching in the core curriculum areas.
3. the development and implementation of content area mentoring and support programs for new teachers; and
4. professional development and recruitment activities to increase the number of teachers from under-represented groups to teaching in the core curriculum areas.

The funds allocated for teacher education will provide professional development activities for eligible teachers from Miami-Dade County Public Schools and participating non-public schools. In accordance with EPDP program guidelines for 2001-2002, 80 percent of the funds will be used to provide professional development activities as requested by the schools, and 20 percent will be used for professional development activities offered at the district level.

Recruitment activities will be implemented by the Office of Human Resources and Development and will include recruitment trips by multi-ethnic recruiting teams to colleges and universities with large enrollments of minority students, as well as a recruitment campaign with materials and presentations targeted for identified groups.

Funds, in the amount of \$3,019,744, will be used for salary, reimbursement costs for teachers, contracted services, travel, printing and duplicating, supplies and equipment.

No local funds are required.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$3,019,744, for funding under the Improving America's Schools Act, 1994, Title II Eisenhower Professional Development Program; Project Cycle: July 12, 2001 through July 31, 2002;
2. extend the grant award, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to fully expend the grant award and thus complete the scope of the project; and
3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
