SUBJECT: THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA v. CHARLIE L. BRADLEY - DOAH CASE NO.: 99-5005

On November 17, 1999, the School Board suspended teacher Charlie L. Bradley from his employment with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, and initiated dismissal proceedings against him for unsatisfactory performance as a school teacher. A hearing was requested and the case was tried on January 31 - February 1, 2001, before DOAH Administrative Law Judge J.D. Parrish. By recommended order entered June 5, 2001, the Administrative Law Judge sustained the School Board's charges and recommended that the termination of Charlie L. Bradley's employment be affirmed.

Exceptions to the Recommended Order have been filed on behalf of the employee. Those exceptions, along with Administration's response to the exceptions, the Recommended Order and complete record in this case, have been forwarded to the School Board members under separate cover. The exceptions seek to have the School Board reject the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida enter a final order in the case of <u>The School Board of Miami-Dade County</u>, Florida v. Charlie L. Bradley, DOAH Case No. 99-5005, either accepting the recommendation of the Administrative Law Judge, or accepting the exceptions set forth in the employee's Exceptions to the Recommended Order.
