**SUBJECT: EXTEND CONTRACT NO. 084-AA02 – RECYCLING OF BALLASTS
AND MERCURY-CONTAINING LAMPS**

The purpose of the bid, opened on February 27, 2001, was to establish a contract, to purchase, at firm unit prices, quantities, as may be required, of recycling of ballasts and mercury-containing lamps, for the Division of Energy, Communications and Fiscal Management. The terms of agreement, as contained in the contract, awarded by the Board on May 16, 2001 provided, that by mutual agreement between the successful vendor and The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, the contract may be extended for three (3) additional one (1) year periods. The contract is currently in its initial year. The awardee has agreed to extend for the first one (1) year extension period, by letter, on file. It is considered to be in the best interest of the Board to extend this contract, for an additional one (1) year period, at the current prices, to benefit from fixed prices, during the next twelve (12) months, inasmuch as the Consumer Price Index (CPI), as of April 2002, indicated an increase of 1.6%.

- Item 1 – Recycling of ballasts (NON-PCB) @ \$0.30 per pound.
- Item 2 – Recycling of ballasts (PCB) @ \$0.48 per pound.
- Item 3 – Recycling of straight fluorescent lamps, four feet or less @ \$0.25 each.
- Item 4 – Recycling of straight fluorescent lamps, greater than four feet @ \$0.30 each.
- Item 5 – Recycling of all other fluorescent lamps @ \$0.26 each.
- Item 6 – Recycling of high intensity discharge and sodium vapor lamps @ \$0.90 each.
- Item 7 – Recycling of broken fluorescent lamps @ \$0.22 each.
