SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM SECME, INC., WITH FUNDING FROM THE BILL AND MELINDA GATES FOUNDATION AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH SECME, INC., TO ESTABLISH A SCIENCE, MATHEMATICS, ENGINEERING, AND TECHNOLOGY EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM, PROJECT CYCLE: NOVEMBER 21, 2002 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2005

Authorization is requested for the Superintendent to accept a grant award, in the amount of \$400,000, from SECME, Inc., with funding from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and to enter into a contractual agreement with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to establish a science, mathematics, engineering, and technology Early College High School in Miami-Dade County Public Schools. The Foundation has committed more than \$40 million to create 70 small high schools nationwide. These small high schools will enable students to earn both a high school diploma and an Associate Degree or two years of college credits by their twelfth grade year.

The Program is a partnership with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, Carnegie Corporation of New York, the Ford Foundation, and the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. SECME, Inc., is one of eight organizations to share these funds and re-grant the funds to create the Early College High School with a science, mathematics, engineering, and technology focus across communities within the Southeast. SECME's primary goal is to increase the pool of under-represented students who are prepared to enter and complete post-secondary studies in these curriculum areas.

Attributes of the Program will include strong linkages with institutions of higher education, high expectations for all students, availability of technology tools for engaging courses of study, active inquiry-based classroom experiences, high achievement on standardized tests, and an emphasis on real world internships. Teachers involved in the Program will receive extensive professional development. Grant funds from the National Science Foundation will also support this project.

Year one of the project cycle is for planning with full implementation during the second and third years of the grant. The Early College High School will be an expansion of the School for Advanced Studies which is housed at Miami-Dade Community College. Staff has met with Dr. Eduardo Padron, College President, Miami-Dade Community College. Miami-Dade Community College has endorsed this initiative and will be the primary higher education institution working collaboratively with the District on the Early College High School plan. Discussions have begun with other higher education institutions i.e., Florida International University and Florida Memorial College that will collaborate with the District on this initiative. This will be a shared project between the Division of Mathematics and Science Education and the Division of Advanced Academic Programs.

Funds in the amount of \$400,000, will cover a full-time project coordinator, instructional materials, travel, and computer equipment.

Official notification of this grant award was received on July 15, 2002, with the first installment of the grant award expected by January of 2003.

No local funds are required for the first year. Years two and three will be supported by the full-time equivalency generated for students enrolled in the participating school.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

1. accept a grant award from SECME, Inc., in the amount of \$400,000, with funding from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, and enter into a contractual agreement SECME, Inc., to establish a science, mathematics, engineering, and technology Early College High School Program, Project Cycle: November 21, 2002 through June 30, 2005;
2. extend this grant program and contractual agreement, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary in order to fully expend the grant and thus complete the scope of the project; and
3. direct Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
