REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT AMENDED GRANT AWARDS FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING UNDER THE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL FEDERAL GRANT PROGRAM AND ENTER INTO SEPARATE CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENTS WITH ARCHIMEDEAN ACADEMY, INC., ON BEHALF OF ARCHIMEDEAN ACADEMY; MATER ACADEMY, INC., ON BEHALF OF MATER ACADEMY CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL; MATER ACADEMY. INC., ON BEHALF OF MATER ACADEMY EAST CHARTER SCHOOL: SANDOR WIENER SCHOOL OPPORTUNITY, INC., ON BEHALF OF SANDOR WIENER SCHOOL OF OPPORTUNITY; VANKARA ACADEMY CHARTER SCHOOL, INC., ON BEHALF OF VANKARA ACADEMY CHARTER SCHOOL: AND THE DOWNTOWN MIAMI CHARTER SCHOOL, INC., ON BEHALF OF DOWNTOWN MIAMI CHARTER SCHOOL, PROJECT CYCLE: APRIL 23, 2002 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2003.

At the School Board Meetings of June 19, 2002 and July 10, 2002, the Board approved acceptance of grant funds in the total amount of \$900,000 for the aforementioned charter schools under the Public Charter Schools Grant Program of the Florida Department of Education (FDOE). Of this amount, indirect costs of \$31,776 (\$5,296 per school) were retained by Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), with a contract amount of \$144,704 for each charter school. On October 9, 2002, the FDOE awarded additional funds under the same program in the amount of \$51,650 to each charter school listed above. Of this amount, indirect costs totaling \$10,998 will be retained by M-DCPS, with a proposed contract amount of \$49,817 for each charter school.

In accordance with the FDOE grant guidelines, M-DCPS will serve in a collaborative partnership with each charter school in the oversight and operation of the school. The Board's approval of the recommended action would not constitute an endorsement of the grant or its intended use. It would merely satisfy the Board's requirement under Section 1002.33, Florida Statutes, Charter Schools, which requires that M-DCPS monitor the revenues and expenditures of the charter schools.

Authorization is requested for M-DCPS to enter into separate contractual agreements with the aforementioned charter schools for the amounts indicated. The charter schools will be responsible for implementing the program outlined in their respective grant applications and expending the grant funds.

Official notification relative to these grant awards was received on October 11, 2002. The budget period for these grants allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from April 23, 2002.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept the amended grant awards from the Florida Department of Education, in the total amount of \$309,900, for funding under the Public Charter School Federal Grant Program and enter into separate contractual agreements with Archimedean Academy, Inc., on behalf of Archimedean Academy, in an amount not to exceed \$49,817; Mater Academy Inc., on behalf of Mater Academy Charter High School, in an amount not to exceed \$49.817; Mater Academy Inc., on behalf of Mater Academy East Charter School, in an amount not to exceed \$49,817; Sandor Wiener School of Opportunity, Inc., on behalf of Sandor Wiener School of Opportunity, in an amount not to exceed \$49,817; Vankara Academy Charter School, Inc., on behalf of Vankara Academy Charter School, in an amount not to exceed \$49,817; and Downtown Miami Charter School, Inc., on behalf of Downtown Miami Charter School, in an amount not to exceed \$49,817, Project Cycle: April 23, 2002 through June 30, 2003;
- 2. approve acceptance of these grant awards in accordance with Section 1002.33, Florida Statutes, Charter Schools. This action is not an endorsement of the activities undertaken by charter schools:
- extend these programs and contractual agreements at no additional cost for a maximum of one year as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to fully expend the grant awards and thus complete the scope of the programs; and
- 4. direct Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
