REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH THE SOUTH FLORIDA AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-STARS FOR FUNDING UNDER THE GOVERNOR'S MENTORING INITIATIVE PROGRAM

Conference Report on Senate Bill 2A, Specific Appropriation 4C, authorizes the Commissioner of Education to award grant dollars for discretionary projects focused on providing mentoring services for students as part of the Governor's Mentoring Initiative.

The purpose of the grant, funded in the amount of \$30,000, is to provide one-on-one mentoring, tutorial, and counseling services to a maximum of twenty (20) targeted ninth grade students at each of the 4 low performing high schools in Miami-Dade County. The schools were selected because they are "double F" or "triple F" schools.

The initiative utilizes the components and strategies already proven successful in the South Florida After-School All-Stars through the Middle School Enrichment Program. Students and their mentors will meet one hour after school, Monday through Thursday. Twice a week they will work on life skills and writing skills, and twice a week they will use the Accelerated Reader program in conjunction with *Arnold's Book Club*.

Authorization is requested to enter into a one year contractual agreement with the South Florida After-School All-Stars in the amount of \$25,023 to implement the Governor's Mentoring Initiative Program. The balance of \$4,977 will be used for salaries.

Ms. Jodie Knofsky is the Executive Director of the South Florida After-School All-Stars.

No matching funds are required as a condition to receive the grant funding.

Official notification of this grant award was received on January 7, 2004, which is after the start of the grant period. Reimbursement of grant-related expenditures is authorized effective July 1, 2003.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education for funding under the Governor's Mentoring Initiative Program in the amount of \$30,000 for the grant period effective July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004;
- 2. enter into a contractual agreement with the South Florida After-School All-Stars, Inc. in the amount of \$25,023, with the balance of \$4,977 used for salaries for the contract period of February 19, 2003 through June 30, 2004;
- 3. extend this grant award and contractual agreement as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, in order to complete the goals of the program; and
- 4. direct Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved or as amended by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board
