SUBJECT: PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF BOARD RULE: INITIAL READING 6Gx13-

5A-1.10, ATTENDANCE AREAS 2003-2004

COMMITTEE: LEGISLATIVE RELATIONS, PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PERSONNEL

SERVICES

In order to initiate rulemaking procedures in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, attendance zone recommendations must be submitted to the School Board. Accordingly, copies of the documents, *Attendance Zone Recommendations and Related Administrative Actions 2004-05*, and *Attendance Zones Previously Approved by the Board 2003-04*, will be forwarded to the School Board members under separate cover and will be on file in the Office of Board Recording Secretary, Room 911, and the Citizen Information Center, Room 158, at the School Board Administration Building, 1450 Northeast Second Avenue, Miami, Florida.

In developing these recommendations, consideration was given to those factors affecting attendance zone changes, e.g., impact on exceptional student education programs, use of available student stations within contiguous areas, degree and extent of transportation, programmatic impact due to lack of student housing, reduction of the number of schools students must attend, integrity of feeder systems, assignment of students from new residential developments to specific schools prior to completion of developments, construction of new schools, promotion and maintenance of diverse school enrollments, and prevention, reduction or elimination of racial isolation to the extent practicable.

The public hearing for the purpose of allowing the community to respond before the School Board to the recommended attendance zone changes will be held on April 26, 2004, at 6:00 p.m., in the School Board Administration Building, School Board Auditorium. Should the School Board, as a result of the March 17, 2004, meeting, modify the recommended attendance zone changes, these changes will be incorporated into the document prior to the April 26, 2004, public hearing.

Attached are the Notice of Intended Action and the rule proposed for amendment. Changes from the current rule are indicated by <u>underscoring</u> words to be added and striking through words to be deleted.

Authorization of the Board is requested for the Superintendent to initiate rulemaking proceedings in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act for the amendment of Board Rule 6Gx13- <u>5A-1.10</u>, Attendance Areas 2003-2004.

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to initiate rulemaking proceedings in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to amend Board Rule 6Gx13- 5A-1.10, Attendance Areas 2003-2004.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on March 17, 2004, its intention to amend Board Rule 6Gx13- 5A-1.10, Attendance Areas 2003-2004, at its meeting of May 19, 2004.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish attendance zones for elementary and secondary schools for the 2004-2005 school year, which, in effect, relieves overcrowding, and better utilizes existing student stations.

Board approval of this rule would modify previously-approved attendance zones and subsequently establish all Board-approved attendance zones as a Board rule.

Persons wishing to speak or who wish to provide information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative as provided by Section 120.541(1), F.S., must do so in writing by April 23, 2004, 12:00 noon, to the Superintendent of Schools, Room 912, at the same address.

ANY PERSON WHO DECIDES TO APPEAL THE DECISION made by The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, with respect to this action will need to ensure the preparation of a verbatim record of the proceedings, including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. (Section 286.0105, Florida Statutes)

ATTENDANCE AREAS 2003-2004 2004-2005

ACCESS Center Assistant Superintendents Region Superintendents are responsible for proposing attendance areas for the schools in their respective ACCESS Center regions. The ACCESS Center Assistant Superintendents Region Superintendents will be assisted in this task by Full Service Schools/Attendance Boundary Committee School Operations and the Attendance Boundary Committee.

The Attendance Boundary Committee will take the following factors into consideration when making decisions regarding school boundaries: impact on exceptional student education programs, use of available student stations within contiguous areas, degree and extent of transportation, programmatic impact due to lack of student housing, reduction of the number of schools students must attend, integrity of feeder systems, assignment of students from new residential developments to specific schools prior to completion of developments, construction of new schools, promotion and maintenance of diverse school enrollments, and prevention, reduction or elimination of racial isolation to the extent practicable.

Also, staff in Full Service Schools/Attendance Boundary Committee School Operations, the Office of Evaluation and Research, Civil Rights and Diversity Compliance, Facilities Planning, and Office of Intergovernmental Affairs and Grants Administration Grants Administration and Federal Legislative Affairs will make student population studies and will assist the Superintendent of Schools in analyzing proposed attendance areas submitted by the ACCESS Centers regions officers and in preparing recommendations for submission to the Board.
