The 2004 Legislative Session adjourned on Friday, April 30, 2004. Of the 2,691 bills actually filed in the Senate and the House, 470 bills or 17% passed.

The annual debate on the District Cost Differential (DCD) was lost. Despite heroic efforts on the part of the Miami-Dade Delegation, the method used in calculating the coveted DCD was changed. Major education legislation focused on the implementation of the universal pre-kindergarten program constitutional amendment, middle school reform, workforce development funding formula, accelerated high school graduation options, teacher quality, and FCAT remedies.
