**SUBJECT: PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF BOARD RULE: FINAL READING 6Gx13-
6C-1.01, APPLIED TECHNOLOGY (VOCATIONAL) AND ADULT
EDUCATION**

**COMMITTEE: LEGISLATIVE RELATIONS, PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PERSONNEL
SERVICES**

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on July 14, 2004, its intention to amend School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6C-1.01, Applied Technology (Vocational) and Adult Education, and to repeal the document, **Handbook and Procedures Manual for Adult Education**, in order to promulgate a new document, **Adult and Applied Technology Education Procedures Manual**, at the meeting of August 18, 2004.

The new document reflects recent actions made by the Florida Legislature and revisions to the Florida School Code related to Adult and Applied Technology programs. In addition, current district procedures have been incorporated.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on July 19, 2004, posted in various places for public information, and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended rule and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this rule has elapsed.

In accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this amended rule is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the rule in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached are the Notice of Intended Action and the rule proposed for amendment. Changes of the current rule are indicated by underscoring words to be added and ~~striking through~~ words to be deleted.

Copies of the document, **Handbook and Procedures Manual for Adult Education**, proposed for repeal, and the new document, **Adult and Applied Technology Education Procedures Manual**, to be incorporated by reference and made part of this rule, will be forwarded to the School Board Members under separate cover, and will be available for inspection by the public in the Office of Board Recording Secretary, Room 924, and the Citizen Information Center, Room 158, 1450 N. E. Second Avenue, Miami, Florida 33132.

RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopt amended School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6C-1.01, Applied Technology (Vocational) and Adult Education, repeal the document, **Handbook and Procedures Manual for Adult Education**, and promulgate the new document, **Adult and Applied Technology Education Procedures Manual**, to incorporate by reference and be made part of this rule, and authorize the Superintendent to file the rule with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective August 18, 2004.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on July 14, 2004, its intention to amend Board Rule 6Gx13- 6C-1.01, Applied Technology (Vocational) and Adult Education, to repeal the document, **Handbook and Procedures Manual for Adult Education**, and promulgate a new document, Adult and Applied Technology Education Procedures Manual, which is incorporated by reference and be made part of this rule, at its meeting of August 18, 2004.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish requirements and procedures for adult and applied technology programs within Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS). These procedures are related to adult and applied technology program accountability, administration, and operations. Furthermore, these procedures establish requirements for program implementation and funding from Florida Department of Education. The extensive reorganization of the **Handbook and Procedures Manual for Adult Education**, which is incorporated by reference and is part of Board Rule 6Gx13- 6C-1.01, is proposed for repeal in order to incorporate a new document, Adult and Applied Technology Education Procedures Manual.

SUMMARY: The composition of the new document, Adult and Applied Technology Education Procedures Manual, reflects recent legislative actions (interpretations or clarifications) updated by Florida Statutes, and Florida Board of Education rules related to Adult and Applied Technology programs. In addition, recommendations from various offices and departments of M-DCPS who have a stake in the operation of adult and applied technology programs have been incorporated into this document.
