SUBJECT: REQUEST SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL OF THE CHARTER SCHOOL APPLICATION FOR RENAISSANCE CHARTER SCHOOL, INC., ON BEHALF OF PRINCETON CHARTER ACADEMY AND AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT FOR A TERM OF TEN YEARS

COMMITTEE: EDUCATION AND SCHOOL OPERATIONS

As established in School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6A-1.47, Charter Schools (K-12), Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) received charter school applications from individuals and/or organizations in the community.

On October 11, 2004, M-DCPS Charter School District Review Committee met to review the application for Princeton Charter Academy and by a unanimous vote made a recommendation for approval of the application to the Superintendent of Schools.

The charter school proposes to serve a maximum of 1,600 students in grades kindergarten through eight, with a maximum of 1,100 students in its first year of operation, commencing with the 2005-2006 school year, at a facility to be located in the Princeton area of southwest Miami-Dade County.

The following is the Founding Board for the charter school: Mr. Ken Haiko, Businessman; Mr. Shane Strum, Marketing Executive; Mr. Dennis Clark, Businessman; Ms. Laura Seidman, Attorney; and Mr. J. Preston Jones, Businessman.

Any pending issues identified by the Charter School District Review Committee in the recommended application, including minimizing the impact on district schools that are under-enrolled, will be addressed satisfactorily in the development of the charter school contractual agreement. The charter school contractual agreement will be submitted for School Board consideration at a subsequent meeting at which time there will be a public hearing to provide for community input.

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RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida:

1. approve the application for Renaissance Charter School, Inc., on behalf of Princeton Charter Academy; and
2. authorize the Superintendent to negotiate a charter school contractual agreement for a term of ten years, commencing with the 2005-2006 school year through the conclusion of the 2014-2015 school year, which reflects the contents of the application as approved by the School Board.
