SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A DECLARATION OF

RESTRICTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH APPLICATION NO. 04-206, WESTERN ESTATES DEVELOPMENT, INC., LOCATED AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SW 154 AVENUE AND SW 184 STREET, PROVIDING FOR A MONETARY DONATION IN ADDITION TO EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IMPACT FEES AS

ALLOWED FOR UNDER THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

Background

Western Estates Development, Inc. (applicant), is requesting a zoning change from EU-1 (Estates) to RU-1 (Single-family Residential) and RU-1M(b) (Modified Single-family), on approximately 5.6 acres located at the northwest corner of SW 154 Avenue and SW184 Street (see location map). The proposed additional 31-unit residential development is estimated to generate 20 students (see attached school impact analysis). The existing EU-1 zoning presently allows the applicant to build 5 units.

Pursuant to the terms of the Interlocal Agreement for School Facility Planning (Interlocal), the School Board (Board), local government, in this instance Miami-Dade County (County), and the development community are to collaborate to develop options which seek to address the impact of proposed residential development on public schools where the development would result in an increase in the schools' FISH % utilization (permanent and relocatable), beyond the threshold review level of 115%. Please note that all of the school facilities impacted by the proposed development meet the referenced threshold.

<u>Additional Information</u>

In connection with the rezoning request and to mitigate the impact of the proposed development on the public school system at all school levels, the applicant is voluntarily proffering a Declaration of Restrictions (Covenant) to the Board. Pursuant to the Covenant, the applicant will donate the amount of \$28,800, in addition to educational facilities impact fees estimated at \$88,128. The entire donation is due prior to final plat approval. In the event the County approves fewer units, the donation will be reduced on a pro-rata basis.

The donation is to be utilized for capital improvements at the impacted schools (Redland Elementary, Redland Middle and South Dade Senior High Schools). To the extent that there are no pending or proposed capital improvements at the referenced schools, the donation would be utilized for capital improvements at other schools within the affected feeder pattern.

The Covenant will be reviewed by the School Board Attorney's Office prior to recordation.

RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to accept a Declaration of Restrictions in connection with Miami-Dade County Application No. 04-206, Western Estates Development, Inc., located at the northwest corner of SW 154 Avenue and SW184 Street, for the provision of a voluntary monetary donation over and above educational facilities impact fees in the amount of \$28,800.


OPERATING COSTS: According to Financial Affairs, the average cost for K-12 grade students amounts to \$5,833 per student. The total annual operating cost for additional students residing in this development, if approved, would total \$116,660.
