SUBJECT: REQUEST TO AUTHORIZE THE SUPERINTENDENT TO ACCEPT A DONATION OF \$172,332 FROM THE YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION OF GREATER MIAMI FOR SCHOOLS HOUSING AFTER-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAMS

COMMITTEE: EDUCATION AND SCHOOL OPERATIONS

The Young Men's Christian Association of Greater Miami (YMCA) is one of three organizations approved to deliver after-school care services in Miami-Dade County Public Schools. It is a part of the YMCA of the United States of America, the largest not-for-profit community service organization and the second largest charity in America. During the past 87 years, the YMCA has provided services to the Greater Miami area. The organization has operated after-school care programs in Miami-Dade County Public Schools since the 1980s.

Authorization is requested to accept a donation of \$172,332, which will be deposited into each of the school's Community School Activity Account to be used at the discretion of the principals for purchasing supplies, materials and equipment to enhance the YMCA after-school program. The funds donated cannot be utilized for part-time hourly staff (i.e., security or custodial). The donation is based on the following:

1. Schools with after-school care enrollment of less than 50 students will receive \$500 per year, payable in two equal installments of \$250 in January and June.
2. Schools with enrollment of 50 students or more will receive funds in the amount of \$1 per week per student. The donation will be disbursed in a monthly basis.

These donations will conform to establish procedures included in the Manual of Internal Funds Accounting for Elementary and Secondary Schools, Board Rules 6Gx13 -3D-1.021 and 6Gx13- 5C-1.061. Each payment will be accompanied by a donation letter and supporting documentation in the form of completed after-school care attendance rosters.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to accept a donation of \$172,332 from Young Men's Christian Association of Greater Miami (YMCA) for schools that house after-school care programs.
