**SUBJECT: REQUEST SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL OF THE CHARTER
 SCHOOL APPLICATION FOR MATER ACADEMY, INC., ON
 BEHALF OF MATER ACADEMY LAKES MIDDLE SCHOOL AND
 AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACTUAL
 AGREEMENT FOR A TERM OF TEN YEARS**

COMMITTEE: INSTRUCTIONAL EXCELLENCE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

As established in School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6A-1.47, Charter Schools (K-12), Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) has received charter school applications from individuals and/or organizations in the community.

On October 12, 2005, M-DCPS Charter School District Review Committee met to review the application for Mater Academy Lakes Middle School and by a unanimous vote made a recommendation for approval of the application to the Superintendent of Schools.

The charter school proposes to serve a maximum of 900 students in grades six through eight commencing with the 2006-2007 school year and through the conclusion of the 2015-2016 school year.

The following is the Founding Board for the charter school: David Concepcion, Legislative Aide; Ruth Jacoby, Educational Administrator; Henri Pferdmenges, Investment Banker; Antonio Roca, Attorney; and Shannine Sadesky, Educator.

The charter school contractual agreement will be submitted for School Board consideration at a subsequent meeting at which time there will be a public hearing to provide for community input.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida:

1. approve the application for Mater Academy, Inc., on behalf of Mater Academy Lakes Middle School; and
2. authorize the Superintendent to negotiate a charter school contractual agreement for a term of ten years, commencing with the 2006-2007 school year and through the conclusion of the 2015-2016 school year, which reflects the contents of the application as approved by the School Board.

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
