**SUBJECT: REQUEST SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL OF THE CHARTER
SCHOOL APPLICATION FOR ADVANTAGE ACADEMY OF MIAMI,
INC., ON BEHALF OF ADVANTAGE CAREER ACADEMY HIGH
SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE A
CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT FOR A TERM OF FIVE YEARS**

COMMITTEE: INSTRUCTIONAL EXCELLENCE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

As established in School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6A-1.47, Charter Schools (K-12), Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) has received charter school applications from individuals and/or organizations in the community.

On November 18, 2005, M-DCPS Charter School District Review Committee met to review the application for Advantage Career Academy High School and by a unanimous vote made a recommendation for approval of the application to the Superintendent of Schools.

The charter school proposes to serve a maximum of 900 students in grades nine through twelve commencing with the 2006-2007 school year and through the conclusion of the 2010-2011 school year.

The following is the Founding Board for the charter school: Linda M. Pottorf, Educational Administrator; Don Clark, YMCA Executive; and Ana Leonart-Rodriguez, Human Resources Executive.

The charter school contractual agreement will be submitted for School Board consideration at a subsequent meeting at which time there will be a public hearing to provide for community input.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida:

1. approve the application for Advantage Academy of Miami, Inc., on behalf of Advantage Career Academy High School; and
2. authorize the Superintendent to negotiate a charter school contractual agreement for a term of five years, commencing with the 2006-2007 school year and through the conclusion of the 2010-2011 school year, which reflects the contents of the application as approved by the School Board.

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
