**SUBJECT: REQUEST SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL OF THE CHARTER SCHOOL APPLICATION FOR LIFE SKILLS CENTER DADE COUNTY, INC., ON BEHALF OF LIFE SKILLS CENTER - HOMESTEAD AND AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT FOR A TERM OF FIVE YEARS**

**COMMITTEE: INSTRUCTIONAL EXCELLENCE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

As established in School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6A-1.47, Charter Schools (K-12), Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) has received charter school applications from individuals and/or organizations in the community.

On November 18, 2005, M-DCPS Charter School District Review Committee met to review the application for Life Skills Center - Homestead and by a majority vote made a recommendation for approval of the application to the Superintendent of Schools.

The charter school proposes to serve a maximum of 700 students in grades nine through twelve with a maximum of 400 students in its first year of operation commencing with the 2006-2007 school year and through the conclusion of the 2010-2011 school year.

The following is the Founding Board for the charter school: Judy Salvador, Human Resources Executive; Jose Antonio Loreda, Attorney; Alicia Rodriguez-Bower, Educational Administrator; Risa J. Berrin, Children's Advocate; Simone Ruiz-Payne Narcis, Educator; Dean William VanderWyden, Educator; and Dannie McMillon, Community Activist.

The charter school contractual agreement will be submitted for School Board consideration at a subsequent meeting at which time there will be a public hearing to provide for community input.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida:

1. approve the application for Life Skills Center Dade County, Inc., on behalf of Life Skills Center - Homestead; and
2. authorize the Superintendent to negotiate a charter school contractual agreement for a term of five years, commencing with the 2006-2007 school year and through the conclusion of the 2010-2011 school year, which reflects the contents of the application as approved by the School Board.

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
