REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION UNDER THE PARTNERSHIPS IN CHARACTER (USDOE) **EDUCATION PROGRAM**

COMMITTEE: INSTRUCTIONAL EXCELLENCE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Authorization is requested to accept a highly competitive grant award from the United States Department of Education (USDOE), in the approximate amount of \$1,513,150, for a four-year award to fund the Partnerships in Character Education Program, for the grant period of October 1, 2005, through September 30, 2009. Building on the District's current character education initiative, the Division of Social Sciences will implement a program that promotes character and ethics education through the adopted nine core values: citizenship, cooperation, fairness, honesty, integrity, kindness, pursuit of excellence, respect, and responsibility.

The Partnerships in Character Education grant, which provides for activities in all District schools, will facilitate the development of a comprehensive, model character and ethics education program that will help students develop socially, ethically, and academically. The grant will reinforce efforts to improve student achievement and literacy, and support the District's new secondary school reform efforts.

Specifically, the Partnerships in Character Education grant will be used to:

- support the development of new curricular resources to teach character and ethics education across the academic disciplines;
- provide regular professional development for teachers and administrators, including training in the foundations of ethical reasoning and teaching strategies to encourage thoughtful classroom discussion on ethical issues; and
- develop home extension activities and parent workshops to support instruction in character and ethics.

No matching funds are required as a condition to receive grant funding. Grant funds, in the amount of \$1,450,906, will be used for personnel, contracted services, teacher stipends, teacher substitutes, printing, equipment, and supplies.

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Official notification of this grant award was received on September 30, 2005. Reimbursement of grant-related expenditures is authorized effective October 1, 2005.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept a grant award from the United States Department of Education (USDOE) under the Partnerships in Character Education Program, in the approximate amount of \$1,513,150, for the grant period of October 1, 2005, through September 30, 2009;
- 2. retain funds from the grant in an amount not to exceed the annually negotiated indirect cost rate, as approved by the FLDOE, as allowed;
- extend this program as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, in order to complete the goals of the program; and
- 4. direct Financial Operations to establish appropriations in the amounts approved or as amended by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
