**SUBJECT: REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO A DISTRICT  
INTERINSTITUTIONAL ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AND  
MIAMI DADE COLLEGE (MDC)**

**COMMITTEE: INSTRUCTIONAL EXCELLENCE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

On July 13, 2005, The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, entered into a District Interinstitutional Articulation Agreement Between The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, and Miami Dade College (MDC), to make available courses that offer both high school and college credit for eligible students. Section 1007.235 of the Florida Statutes requires that superintendents of school districts and presidents of state universities that serve the school districts develop and implement a comprehensive articulation agreement for students enrolled in their respective school district and service areas.

Dual Enrollment (DE) is an academic acceleration mechanism in which eligible senior high school students can register for university classes with the opportunity to receive high school and university credit concurrently. The state pays for the classes. The District generates FTE funding for its DE students which is used to pay for DE textbooks. Students are responsible for their own transportation.

As part of the recently passed A++ bill that was signed into law by Governor Jeb Bush, districts are now required to weigh Dual Enrollment (DE) courses the same as Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Advanced International Certification of Education courses. Students entering grade nine in the 2006-2007 school year, must receive weighting of DE courses offered by school districts and community colleges when grade point averages are calculated. These changes do not apply to students enrolled in grades nine through twelve prior to the 2006-2007 school year.

Ms. Rosario S. Roman, District Director, School & College Relations, oversees the articulation process at Miami Dade College.
