The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, announced on October 11, 2006, its intention to amend School Board Rule 6Gx13- <u>5A-1.10</u>, Attendance Areas 2006-2007, at its meeting of November 21, 2006, to revise procedures for establishing school attendance boundaries for 2007-2008 and 2008-2009.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on October 16, 2006, posted in various places for public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended rule and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this rule has elapsed.

In accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this rule is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the rule in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached are the Notice of Intended Action and the amended rule. Changes from the current rule are indicated by <u>underscoring</u> words to be added and striking through words to be deleted.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopt amended Board rule 6Gx13- <u>5A-1.10</u>, Attendance Areas 2006-2007, and authorize the Superintendent to file the rule with The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective November 21, 2006.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on October 11, 2006, its intention to amend Board Rule 6Gx13- <u>5A-1.10</u>, Attendance Areas 2006-2007, at its meeting of November 21, 2006.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish procedures allowing the Superintendent of Schools, with the assistance of School Operations and the Office of School Facilities, to develop proposed boundary recommendations that are reviewed by the Attendance Boundary Committee. This will result in redefining the current process through which attendance zones are established for elementary and secondary schools.

SUMMARY: Thirty-nine thousand (39,000) student stations have been added in the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school years and an additional 53,700 student stations will be built over the next two years. The student stations are being built to relieve overcrowding, to be compliance with constitutional requirements related to Class Size Reduction, and to eliminate relocatable/portable classrooms. The Office of School Facilities and School Operations will provide the Attendance Boundary Committee and the community with attendance boundaries for schools opening in 2007-2008 and 2008-2009. Community and Attendance Boundary Committee meetings will be held to present the attendance boundaries established for 2007-2008 and 2008-2009. This rule will ensure that appropriate relief is given to the intended schools.

Attendance

ATTENDANCE AREAS 2006-2007 2007-2008 and 2008-2009

Regional Superintendents are The Superintendent of Schools is responsible for proposing attendance areas for the district schools in their respective Regional Center. The Regional Superintendents of Schools will be assisted in this task by School Operations, the Office of School Facilities, and the Attendance Boundary Committee.

To comply with the mandate of Class Size Reduction the Office of School Facilities and School Operations will provide the Attendance Boundary Committee and the community with attendance boundaries for schools opening in 2007-2008 and 2008-2009. Community and Attendance Boundary Committee meetings will be held to present the attendance boundaries established for 2007-2008 and 2008-2009.

The Attendance Boundary Committee will take the following factors into consideration when making decisions—reviewing proposed attendance areas regarding school boundaries: compliance with Class Size Reduction Mandate, impact on exceptional student education programs, use of available student stations within contiguous areas, degree and extent of transportation, programmatic impact due to lack of student housing, reduction of the number of schools students must attend, integrity of feeder systems, assignment of students from new residential developments to specific schools prior to completion of developments, construction of new schools, promotion and maintenance of diverse school enrollments, and prevention, reduction or elimination of racial isolation to the extent practicable.

Also, sStaff in School Operations, Office of School Facilities, Information Technology Services, Department of Transportation, Research Services, Civil Rights and Diversity Compliance, Office of School Facilities, and Office of Intergovernmental Affairs, Grants Administration and Community Services will make student population studies and will assist the Superintendent of Schools in providing data, analyzeing proposed attendance areas submitted by the Regional Centers and in prepareing recommendations for submission to the Board.
