**SUBJECT: REQUEST SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL OF THE CHARTER SCHOOL APPLICATION FOR THE RENAISSANCE CHARTER SCHOOL, INC., ON BEHALF OF SOUTH DADE CHARTER SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT FOR A TERM OF TEN YEARS**

**COMMITTEE: INSTRUCTIONAL EXCELLENCE AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

As established in School Board Rule 6Gx13- 6A-1.47, Charter Schools (K-12), Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) has received charter school applications from individuals and/or organizations in the community.

On November 27, 2006, M-DCPS Charter School District Review Committee met to review the application for South Dade Charter School and by a majority vote made a recommendation for approval of the application to the Superintendent of Schools.

The charter school proposes to serve a maximum of 1,800 students in grades kindergarten through eight commencing with the 2007-2008 school year and continuing throughout the term of the contract, which ends on June 30, 2017, and concludes in the 2016-2017 school year.

The following is the Founding Board for the charter school: Mr. Ken Haiko, Business Executive, Mr. Shane Strum, Business Executive, Mr. Dennis P. Clark, Banker, Mr. Thomas P. Wheeler, Attorney, and Ms. Laura R. Seidman, Attorney.

The charter school contractual agreement will be submitted for School Board consideration at a subsequent meeting at which time there will be a public hearing to provide for community input.
