**SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A MONETARY DONATION IN CONNECTION WITH LAND USE AND MAJOR USE SPECIAL PERMIT APPLICATION HASRED INC. & MAVICMAR, LOCATED AT 3840 NW 7 STREET, MIAMI, PROVIDING FOR A MONETARY DONATION OVER AND ABOVE EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES IMPACT FEES AS ALLOWED FOR UNDER THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**

Background

Hasred Inc. & Mavicmar (applicant), requested and received approval for a change to the City of Miami's (City) Future Land Use Map on an approximate .20-net acre site. The applicant is seeking to re-designate land from Medium Density Multifamily Residential (65 dwelling units/acre), to Restricted Commercial (which allows either commercial development or construction of 150 dwelling units/acre). The site is located at 3840 NW 7 Street, Miami (see location map). The proposed 17 additional multifamily dwelling units are estimated to generate 5 students (see attached school impact analysis). The existing land use presently allows the applicant to build 13 multifamily units, for a total of 30 dwelling units. The applicant has advised that although the Restricted Commercial designation allows for either residential or commercial development, commercial units are intended to be built.

Pursuant to the terms of the Interlocal Agreement for School Facility Planning (Interlocal), the School Board (Board), local government, in this instance the City, and the development community are to collaborate to develop options which seek to address the impact of proposed residential development on public schools where the development would result in an increase in the schools' FISH % utilization (permanent and relocatable), beyond the threshold review level of 115%; in this case, two of the school facilities that would serve the proposed development meet the referenced threshold.

Additional Information

At its April 13, 2005 meeting, the Board approved School District criteria that allow District staff to make recommendations on residential zoning applications that impact upon public schools beyond the 115% of FISH capacity review threshold. The criteria also outline specific steps to guide District staff's consultation with developers and input at public hearings, in an attempt to provide the required number of student stations to mitigate the impact of proposed residential development. Subsequent to a determination

by District staff that the proposed development is above the review threshold, the developer is requested to consider and select from several mitigation options. As a result, the District met with the above applicant to discuss possible mitigation options.

Proposed mitigation

The applicant has volunteered to mitigate the full capital cost of the additional elementary and senior high school student stations, and proffered a monetary donation covering the capital cost of 2 elementary school student stations at \$14,385 (\$28,770), and 2 senior high school student stations at \$21,825 (\$43,650), less educational facilities impact fees estimated at \$25,500, for a total donation of \$46,920. The entire donation is due prior to the issuance of a building permit. In the event the City approves fewer units, the donation will be reduced on a pro-rata basis. Should the applicant build commercial units as opposed to residential, then this mitigation would not apply.

The donation is to be utilized for capital improvements to relieve the impacted schools.

The Covenant will be reviewed by the School Board Attorney's Office prior to recordation.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to accept a monetary donation in connection with a Land Use and Major Use Special Permit application, Hasred Inc. & Mavicmar, located at 3840 NW 7 Street, Miami, for the provision of a voluntary monetary donation over and above educational facilities impact fees in the amount of \$46,920.
