The Superintendent of Schools has recommended that this student be expelled from the regular and adult programs of Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) and assigned to an [ഉ alternative school/program for the maximum time permitted under law, which is the 2007-2008 school year, 2008 summer session, and the 2008-2009 school year.

The parents were duly notified of the recommendation for expulsion and were given an opportunity for a conference with staff and were advised of their right to a hearing before an impartial hearing examiner. The parents chose not to request a hearing.

The basis for the recommendation is:

The student's aggravated battery on a student.

This act constitutes a Level V behavior of the Code of Student Conduct. > Revised

The student has been assigned to Miami Douglas MacArthur South and will be provided educational services during the term of the expulsion period.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida:

- expel the student specified in the supplemental material SM-15 (2007-2008), furnished under separate cover to Board members, from the regular and adult programs of Miami-Dade County Public. Schools and assign to an alternative school/program for the maximum time permitted under law, which is the 2007-2008 school year, 2008 summer session, and the 2008-2009 school year;
- provide educational services in an alternative school/program during the term of the expulsion; and
- 3. following the term of the expulsion, permit the student to be returned to a regular school program in Miami-Dade County Public Schools, if approved by School Operations.
