Introduction

Staff has completed the selection process for one or more Architectural/Engineering Projects Consultants (A/EPC) firm(s) to provide Architectural/Engineering services for miscellaneous projects in which the construction cost estimates do not exceed the current statutory limit of \$1.0 million, study activities with professional fees less than \$50,000, and services of a specific nature, per State Statute.

Twenty-six firms applied, and based on the established evaluation criteria, twenty firms were short-listed. On January 10th and 11th, 2008, the Selection Committee interviewed and ranked the firms as follows:

Staff initiated negotiations for this term contract based on the order of final ranking and has successfully concluded negotiations with the five top-ranked firms, M.C. Harry & Associates, Inc. (MCH), Wolfberg Alvarez & Partners (WAP), The Architectural Partnership, Inc. (TAP), Corzo Castella Carballo Thompson Salman, PA (C3TS), and Brown & Brown Architects (BBA), as follows:

Terms and Conditions

A. Basic Services - General

The negotiated fees for Basic Services are based on a percentage of the construction budget, as approved by staff, prior to the start of each project. Individual work orders will be issued for required services based on the percentage fee converted to a Lump Sum (LS) fee. At the option of staff, the A/EPC will conduct on-site observations (site visits) and/or additional project meetings during construction, at pre-negotiated rates.

Basic Services fees include all required services and consultants, unless otherwise noted in a specific Work Order. Basic Services fees shall be paid based on the percentage of completion per terms of the A/EPC Agreement.

B. Other Terms and Conditions

- The term of these Agreements is four years, commencing March 12, 2008, and ending March 11, 2012, with the second, third and fourth year renewals at the option of the Board.
- In the absence of record drawings, the A/EPC may be compensated, as shown on the schedule below, for A/E services performed to develop record drawings and/or verify existing field conditions (prior authorization by MDCPS' Project Manager is required):

- For study activities with professional fees of up to \$50,000, the Board and the A/EPC must agree, in writing, prior to the commencement of the work, on the maximum number of hours and a not-to-exceed amount, or a lump sum fee for each project.
- The provisional multiplier for hourly compensation shall be limited to 2.45. This rate is subject to audit by the Board and may be adjusted as the result of audit findings. If so, any changes would be submitted to the Board for final approval.
- The multiplier for Direct Personnel Expense, for assignment of A/EPC technical staff (i.e. Architects, Engineers, Project Managers and Field Representatives) to specific projects and housed in offices other than the A/EPC's own offices, shall be limited to a 1.70 multiplier times the actual hourly rates.
- The Agreement provides for indemnification and hold harmless provisions to the Board and its employees by the A/EPC due to A/EPC's negligence. The A/EPC shall maintain at least a \$1,000,000 Professional Liability insurance policy with a maximum deductible of \$25,000 per claim. These limits and terms are as recommended by the District's Office of Risk & Benefits Management.
- The Agreement may be terminated by the Board, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the A/EPC; whereas, the A/EPC may terminate the Agreement, with cause only, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Board.

- The Board is under no obligation to assign a minimum number of work orders or to compensate a minimum amount of professional fees to any A/EPC firm.
- All firms have agreed to the Terms and Conditions of the A/EPC Agreement and will commence services upon commissioning by the Board.
