Project RYSE (Refugee Youth Succeeding in Education) provides limited English proficient refugee youth with supplemental educational opportunities and services. The grant is part of the State of Florida Increasing Refugee Student Achievement Program. The goals are for students to succeed academically and provide community awareness that enable them to acculturate and become part of our community.

Approximately 50 students from G. Holmes Braddock Senior High School established a liaison with the Bird Road Senior Center as part of their community service project. Students prepared two celebrations for seniors - one for Valentine's Day and one for Mother's Day. They prepared greeting cards, decorations, hand-made gifts and elicited food donations for the needy seniors.

In addition, they fed those seniors that needed assistance with eating, taught them how to dance and played dominos with them. They established a relationship with the seniors and exchanged letters with them from February - June, 2009. The goal was for the students to realize that as refugees they receive a lot from this country but need to learn to give back to the community.

Under the supervision of Dr. Beatriz Diaz, Supervisor, Adult ESOL and Dr. Joanne H. Urrutia, Administrative Director, Bilingual Education and World Languages, Project RYSE students have made significant academic progress.
