The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, recognizes the importance of ensuring that students continue to strengthen reading skills and develop a passion for reading beyond the instructional requirements. Historically, schools have received on an annual basis a District recommended summer reading list which is distributed prior to summer recess. Teachers use the list and often adapt it based on the needs of students in their schools. The selection of books and designation of assignments varies from school to school.

Based on the assignments made by teachers, parents must often purchase multiple books. My office has received correspondence from parents concerned by the number of books assigned, the costs associated with the purchase of the texts, and the difficulty encountered in finding some of the selections assigned.

In an effort to ensure that children are academically engaged during the summer and to address the aforementioned concerns, it is requested that the Superintendent:

- review current practices and guidelines for the selection of books for summer reading;
- create a list of recommended books;
- provide suggested activities/assignments based on the readings;
- develop recommendations on strategies for schools to use when students are unable to afford the summer reading materials; and
- identify mechanisms by which teachers within a school can coordinate summer reading assignments.

The cost and availability of the books selected along with the education mission of this District should be part of the selection process guidelines.

The recommendations should be easy to access for all stakeholders one month prior to the end of the school year.

The intent of this item is not to impede school instructional or administrative staff members' ability to create assignments and be limited by a District wide summer reading list. Nevertheless, the cost and availability of the books selected along with the education mission of this District should be factored in by staff.

ACTION PROPOSED BY DR. MARTIN KARP:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, direct the Superintendent to:

- use education research to develop guidelines for the selection of books for the summer reading list; create a list of recommended books; provide suggested activities/assignments based on the readings; develop recommendations on strategies for schools to use when students are unable to afford the summer reading materials; identify mechanisms by which teachers within a school can coordinate summer reading assignments; and
- 2. ensure access/distribution to all stakeholders of the summer reading list and the Superintendent's recommendation one month prior to the end of the school year, which would include an on online component
