The students of the 2011-2012 Miami Lakes Middle School Project Citizen Class developed an award-winning safety project entitled, "Warning! Illegal Passing of School Buses," focusing on the unlawful practice by vehicles of passing school buses that are stopped to allow for students to embark and disembark.

The data collected by various public organizations since 1995 indicated that this was a growing problem. The students received support from various national organizations, in addition to 20 percent of school districts across Florida. They contacted their State Representative and persuaded him to sponsor their bill. The students, well prepared with the bill and talking points, proceeded to find a sponsor in the Florida Senate who would file a companion bill. On January 2012, HB 269 and SB 250 opened the way for school districts across Florida to protect the safety of their students with the automated enforcement: the placing of exterior cameras on school buses.

On May 24th, the Miami Lakes Middle School Project Citizen entry won first place at the State Competition held at the Palm Beach Convention Center. They advanced to represent our state at the National Competition in California on July 19th - 21st, where they received a Superior rating, one of only five states to receive such an honor.
