CONTRACT AMENDMENTS

Section 1002.33(7)(c), F. S. provides that a charter contract may be modified during its initial term or any renewal term. Listed below are two contract amendments. Pursuant to School Board Policy 9800, Charter Schools, the M-DCPS' Charter School Contract Review Committee (CRC) was only required to negotiate one of the two amended contracts presented on this agenda. The recommendations to the Superintendent were as follows:

^{*}Pursuant to s.1002.33, "high performing" is a designation made by the Commission of Education for certain charter schools that allow them to increase enrollment, expand grade levels, submit quarterly rather than monthly financial reports, consolidate charters, and/or modify charter term to 15 years.

Any significant increase in charter school student enrollment (Charter FTE) directly impacts the District's operating budget as well as instructional and non-instructional staffing levels. Only one of the amendments to the charter school contracts in this Board item represents an increase in overall charter school enrollment. To ensure that the District's financial position remains positive, Board authorization is requested to allow a Reduction-in-Force/Layoff only if it becomes necessary. Any such Reduction-in-Force/Layoff affecting instructional and non-instructional staff would be implemented in accordance with School Board policies and applicable collective bargaining agreements. The number of position reductions will not exceed the stated Initial Loss included in this item and will be reevaluated and adjusted in subsequent years to reflect changes in FTE. The impact caused by the contract is provided in Attachment A.

Advanced Learning Charter School, Inc., on behalf of Highly Inquisitive & Versatile Education (HIVE) Preparatory School, pursuant Section 1002.331(3), F.S., High-Performing Charter Schools, to (i.) add grade six through grade eight; (ii.) increase student enrollment as follows: (a) 2014-2015: maximum of 552 students; and (b) 2015-2028: maximum of 900 students; (iii.) modify the term of the renewal contract from a 5-year term to a 15-year term, commencing with the 2013-2014 school year and ending on June 30, 2028; and (iv.) add an additional facility located at 17701 N.W. 57th Avenue, Miami, 33055: Folio No. 30-2107-005-3140, commencing with the 2014-2015 school year.
- 2. Approve a Reduction-in-Force/Layoff as needed, only to the extent described in this item as Total Initial Loss, in accordance with School Board policies and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Initial Year Loss: The revenue and positions indicated as "Initial Year Loss" provide an estimate of the potential impact on the District's General Fund (\$454,875), instructional staffing (5 positions), and non-

instructional staffing (3 positions). The loss of revenue is based on 95% of FEFP funds per student and 75% of the initial year enrollment projection that the District will not realize for the current fiscal year.
