A native of Cuba, Dr. Marty came to the United States with her family when she was four (4) years old. She lived in New Jersey for several years, and then moved to Miami, Florida. Dr. Marty is a graduate of the University of Miami Medical School.

Aileen M. Marty is a professor of Infectious Diseases in the Department of Medicine at the Florida International University Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine.

Dr. Marty served in the United States Navy for 25 years specializing in tropical medicine, infectious disease pathology, disaster medicine, and in the science, medical response and policy involving weapons of mass destruction.

Dr. Marty has served as a professor of emerging infections and pathology at the Uniformed Services University, the Johns Hopkins University, the National Defense University, and the University of Valencia, Spain. } Revised

The U.S. Navy's Bureau of Medicine and Surgery recognized her as an expert on chemical, biological, radiation, and high-energy weapons and called on her to develop plans, training, and policy for government agencies including the White House and the National Security Administration.

Dr. Marty is one of only 403 people listed in the international roster as a member of the United Nations Monitoring and Verification Team for Weapons of Mass Destruction.

Dr. Marty has won several awards for all of her contributions in the fields of medicine and science, as well as for community service including but not limited to University of Miami Medical Alumni 2015 Hall of Fame Award; In the Company of Women Award; Outstanding Hispanic Professional – Department of Defense; Scholar of Highest Distinction – Naval War College.

For nine years she has worked with and for the World Health Organization in Europe, the Americas, and Africa – most recently in the fight against the 2014 Ebola epidemic in Nigeria. Dr. Marty risked her own health and safety to work on the frontlines of the Ebola fighting effort in West Africa. } Revised
