SUBJECT: PROPOSED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

SETTLEMENT OF CLAIMS BY JCON GROUP CORP. AND THE HANOVER INSURANCE COMPANY AS SURETY AGAINST THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA

This matter involves a settlement in connection to all claims for work associated with the Partial Replacement and Minor Renovations at Florida City Elementary School (Project NO. 00708400) by JCON Group Corp. and the Hanover Insurance Group as surety.

On June 15, 2011, the School Board awarded Project No. 00708400, "Partial Replacement and Minor Renovations of Florida City Elementary School to JCON Group Corp. On or about July 27, 2015 JCON submitted its final payment application for work completed under the contract. In response to the JCON's submittal, the School Board informed JCON that there remains an outstanding and incomplete final punch list for work required. In response, the Hanover Insurance Group, as an assignee and equitable subrogee to JCON, made a demand upon the School Board for the remaining funds alleged due under the contract in the amount of One Hundred Sixty-Three Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Eight Dollars (\$163,498.00).

This Agenda Item amicably resolves all issues between the parties surrounding the work associated with the Partial Replacement and Minor Renovations at Florida City Elementary School (Project NO. 00708400) by JCON Group Corp. and The Hanover Insurance Group as surety.

As a result of this settlement agreement, the School Board shall pay the Hanover Insurance Company the total principal amount of <u>Seventy Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$70,500.00)</u> representing the negotiated settlement between the Parties of all claims of JCON Group Corp. and the Hanover Insurance Group as surety for work associated with the Partial Replacement and Minor Renovations at Florida City Elementary School (Project NO. 00708400).
