Derek, whose name means gifted leader, was employed by Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) in 2005 as a teacher at Barbara Hawkins Elementary School. There, he taught third grade for four years and fifth grade for three years. As a math teacher, ninety-one percent of his students were proficient on the state's standardized test. Wanting to increase the school-wide quality of teaching and learning, he took on the role of Mathematics Instructional Coach in which the math department was recognized by Governor Rick Scott for ranking in the top 3%, in student achievement growth, amongst all schools in the state of Florida.
