The South Dade Senior High School wrestling team has become known as "The Dynasty"; an appropriate moniker for a team winning their 17th consecutive District Championship, 8th consecutive Greater Miami Athletic Conference Championship, 6th consecutive Regional Championship and their 5th consecutive State Championship. The 2018 team State Championship titles are the 13<sup>th</sup> and the 14<sup>th</sup> State Championships in school history.

South Dade is the first team in Florida history to win 5 consecutive "Big School" State Championships. In January, the "Bucs" also won the inaugural FHSAA Class 3A Dual Meet State Championship. This is the first time in Miami-Dade County history a team has won 2 team State Championships in the same year. They advanced a county best 13 out of 14 wrestlers to the State Championships and placed 7 of their wrestlers in the finals, 4 of which won individual state titles. 10 out of the 13 state qualifiers made it to the top of the state podium, all placing in the top 4 at state.

The team was led by 3x State Champion, Brevin Balmeceda and 2x State Champion, Bretli Reyna, sons of Head Coach Vic Balmeceda and Assistant Coach Humberto Reyna. Brevin Balmeceda became the first wrestler in Miami-Dade County history to win the Super 32 Challenge. The Super 32 is considered the toughest wrestling tournament in the country. Brevin is currently the #1 ranked junior in the Nation. 12 South Dade wrestlers were named to the Miami Herald's first team All Dade County Wrestling Team. 5 Buccaneers are nationally ranked.

In the past 21 years at South Dade Senior High, Head Wrestling Coach Vic Balmeceda has produced 60 individual State Champions, 89 State Place-finishers and has a dual meet record of (380-20). These impressive achievements have been recognized by Wrestling USA Magazine, who ranked the South Dade High School wrestling team as 12th in the nation.
