**SUBJECT:** FINAL READING: PROPOSED PROMULGATION OF NEW BOARD POLICY 9143, SECURE OUR FUTURE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

At its regular meeting of October 10, 2018, the School Board approved Agenda Item A-2 (Proposed Promulgation Of New Board Policy 9143, *Secure Our Future Advisory Committee*) authorizing the Superintendent to initiate rulemaking to promulgate new Board Policy 9143, *Secure Our Future Advisory Committee*.

On November 6, 2018, the voters of Miami-Dade County authorized the School Board to levy an ad valorem assessment to improve compensation for teachers and instructional personnel, and to increase school safety and security personnel, with oversight by a citizen advisory committee (Referendum). This item requests that the Board adopt proposed new Board Policy 9143, *Secure Our Future Advisory Committee*, establishing a citizen oversight committee for the purpose of monitoring the distribution of the proceeds from the Referendum, providing advice to the Superintendent and the School Board, and providing for an annual report to the community.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on October 15, 2018, and posted in various places for public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the policy and to individuals requesting notification. The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption of this policy has elapsed.

In accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, this policy is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida for adoption and authorization to file in the official records of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached is the Notice of Intended Action and proposed New Policy.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopt Board Policy 9143, *Secure Our Future Advisory Committee* and authorize the Superintendent to file the policy with the School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective November 20, 2018.

## NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on October 10, 2018, its intention to promulgate new policy 9143, *Secure Our Future Advisory Committee*, on November 20, 2018.

**PURPOSE AND EFFECT:** The purpose of the new policy is to establish the Secure Our Future Advisory Committee (Committee) to review, monitor, make recommendations to the School Board and Superintendent, and inform the public regarding the distribution and use of proceeds generated as a result of the referendum approved by voters on November 6, 2018, if it passes. Committee members will be appointed for a term of four (4) years and may be reappointed. Voting members shall not be current employees. The Committee shall meet at least two (2) times per year and may hold other meetings as necessary. All meetings and Committee proceedings must comply with Florida's Sunshine and Public Records laws, F.S. Chapters 119 and 286.011. The Committee shall exist until all proceeds of the Referendum, if it passes, have been expended and accounted for or upon a vote or action of the School Board sunsetting the existence of the Committee.

**SUMMARY:** The proposed newly promulgated Board Policy would establish the purpose, membership, function and duration of a citizen's oversight committee as stipulated in Resolution 18-047 and identifies it as the Secure Our Future Advisory Committee. The Committee would review, monitor, and make recommendations regarding the proceeds of the November 6, 2018 referendum for teacher and instructional personnel compensation and school security personnel, if it passes.

Persons requesting such a hearing or who wish to provide information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative as provided in Section 120.54(1), F.S., must do so in writing by November 5, 2018, to the Superintendent, Room 912, at the same address.

ANY PERSON WHO DECIDES TO APPEAL THE DECISION made by The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, with respect to this action will need to ensure the preparation of a verbatim record of the proceedings, including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. NEW POLICY

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SECURE OUR FUTURE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

2 The purpose of the Secure Our Future Advisory Committee (Committee) is to review,  
3 monitor, and make recommendations to the Superintendent and School Board, and  
4 inform the public regarding the use of proceeds generated from the assessment of a  
5 0.75 mill levy of ad valorem taxes (Referendum) approved by voters on November 6,  
6 2018, for the purpose of improving compensation for high quality teachers and  
7 instructional personnel, and increasing school safety and security personnel. The  
8 Committee is formed to provide transparency and instill confidence in Miami-Dade  
9 County taxpayers that these funds will be used for the purpose stated in the  
10 Referendum.

11 **Responsibilities**

12 A. The Committee should:

- 13 1. review and monitor the distribution of the proceeds from the  
14 Referendum, including monitoring state funding allocations  
15 so that Referendum proceeds are not used in a manner that  
16 would indicate supplanting of funds; as well as monitor  
17 funding trends which may impact the District beyond the  
18 initial referendum period;
- 19 2. advise the Superintendent and the Board on the use of the  
20 proceeds from the Referendum, excluding all matters related  
21 to collective bargaining; and
- 22 3. assist in informing the community of the use and distribution  
23 of the proceeds from the Referendum and participate in  
24 District community outreach efforts.

25 B. The Committee's reviews and recommendations shall be reported on  
26 an annual basis to the Superintendent, the Board, and the  
27 community. The annual report shall assess the fidelity of  
28 distribution of proceeds in accordance with the ballot provisions to  
29 ensure that taxpayer funds generated by the Referendum are being  
30 used exclusively for operating expenses to improve compensation for  
31 high quality teachers, instructional personnel, and to increase  
32 school safety and security personnel.

1 **Membership**

2 The Committee shall be comprised of the following nineteen (19) voting and five (5) }  
3 non-voting members. Appointing persons and entities may also appoint an alternate }  
4 for voting members. No voting members may be School Board employees.

5 A. Voting Members

6 1. One (1) member and alternate appointed by each Board  
7 member.

8 2. Two (2) members appointed by the Superintendent.

9 3. Dade County Council PTA/PTSA President or designee.

10 4. Chair of the Board's Audit and Budget Advisory Committee or  
11 designee.

12 5. One (1) member appointed by the National Association for the  
13 Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

14 6. One (1) member appointed by the Spanish American League  
15 Against Discrimination (SALAD).

16 7. One (1) member appointed by the Business Advisory Council.

17 8. One (1) member appointed by the Family/Community  
18 Involvement Advisory Council (FCIAC).

19  
20 9. One (1) retired teacher and one (1) retired law enforcement }  
21 officer appointed by the School Board Chair.

22 B. Ex-Officio Non-Voting Members

23 1. Inspector General of the District.

24 2. One (1) member appointed by the United Teachers of Dade.

25 3. One (1) member appointed by the Fraternal Order of Police.

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28 4. One (1) member appointed by the District Student  
29 Government Association.  
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5. One (1) member appointed by the MDCPS Retirement Benefits Council

C. Ex-Officio Committee Staff

1. Chief Financial Officer
2. Chief Human Capital Officer of the District.
3. Chief of Police and District Security of the District.
4. Chief Auditor of the District.
5. Chief of Staff of the District or Designee

D. Membership Qualifications

1. Each voting member shall have an outstanding reputation for civic involvement, integrity, responsibility, and business or professional ability.
2. Members are also subject to the residency and conflict of interest provisions of Policy 9140 - *Citizen's Advisory Committees*. In addition, Board member appointments are subject to the multiple appointment restriction in Policy 9140.
3. Members should generally reflect the geographic, ethnic, racial and gender diversity of Miami-Dade County.

E. Terms

1. The term of service for all members is four (4) years and members may be reappointed for unlimited terms.
2. Newly-elected Board members and appointed superintendents may reappoint current Committee members or appoint a new member regardless of the time remaining on the current member's term. Appointments and reappointments should be made within forty five (45) days of taking office.
3. A member should be automatically removed if the member is absent from three (3) consecutive meetings during the calendar year, except in the event of extenuating circumstances and subject to a vote of the Committee. In extraordinary circumstances and subject to a vote of the Committee, a member may participate telephonically provided

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1 the member is present for the entire meeting. The appearance  
2 by phone of any member of the Committee may not be relied  
3 upon for the purposes of establishing a quorum.

4 4. Vacancies due to resignation, disqualification, or removal  
5 should be filled within forty-five (45) days.

6 F. Conflict of Interest

7 1. Members are subject to the conflict of interest provisions of  
8 Policy 9140, *Citizen's Advisory Committees*.

9 **Meetings**

10 A. The Committee shall elect a chair and vice-chair and may elect other  
11 officers as necessary. The term of office shall be two (2) years.

12 B. The Committee shall meet at least two (2) times per year and may  
13 hold other meetings as necessary. All meetings and Committee  
14 proceedings must comply with Florida's Sunshine and Public  
15 Records laws, F.S. Chapters 119 and 286.011.

16 C. A majority of the voting members shall constitute a quorum.

17 D. Meetings shall be conducted according to the latest version of *Robert*  
18 *Rules of Order*.

19 E. The offices of the Superintendent and Board Attorney shall provide  
20 staff support to the Committee as necessary to accomplish its  
21 purpose.

22 **Duration**

23 The Committee shall exist until all proceeds of the Referendum have been expended  
24 and accounted for or upon a vote or action of the School Board sunsetting the  
25 existence of the Committee.
