## **Section 504 Plan**

| Description    | A plan detailing the individualized needs for a student to access their education . In order to receive a Free and Appropriate Education (FAPE).  | A plan for how a school will provide support or remove barriers for a student with a disability. Disability may be considered as temporary or permanent.  |
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| Purpose        | Provides individualized special education and related services required for a student to access their education, always at no cost to the families.   | Provides services and changes to the learning environment to enable students to learn alongside their peers, at no cost to families.  |
| Applicable Law | The <u>Individuals with Disabilities Education Act</u> (IDEA) Provides funding.   | Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973  Does not provide funding, but funding can be taken away for non-compliance.  |
| Eligibility    | <ol> <li>Two Requirements:         <ol> <li>A child with on or more of the 13 disabilities listed in the IDEA.</li> </ol> </li> <li>The disability must affect the child's educational performance and/or ability to learn and benefit for the general education curriculum. Child must need specialized instruction to make progress in school.</li> </ol> <li>*Eligibility requirements for disabilities vary from state to state, thus the need for re-evaluation for out -of-state transfers.</li>  | <ol> <li>Two Requirements:</li> <li>A child with any disability. There is a wide range covered in Section 504.</li> <li>The disability must interfere with a child's ability to learn in the general education environment.</li> <li>* To meet eligibility, a student must meet any one of the following three requirements:         <ol> <li>(i) has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities,</li> <li>(ii) has a record of such an impairment, or</li> <li>(iii) is regarded as having such an impairment."</li> </ol> </li> </ol> |
| Contents       | <ol> <li>The IEP sets learning goals and the individuals services in order to make adequate progress to those goals. Some things an IEP must include:         <ol> <li>Current levels of academic and functional performance,</li> <li>Annual educational goals and how they will be monitored,</li> <li>Services (special education, related, supplementary, extended school year, transportation),</li> <li>Accommodations,</li> <li>Modifications,</li> <li>Participation in standardized tests,</li> <li>Participation with the general education curriculum and non-disabled peers.</li> </ol> </li> </ol> | The 504 Plan delineates what the school will do to provide student access to the general education learning environment. 504 Plans include:  1. Specific accommodations, supports and services,  2. Names of who will provide the services,  3. Name of the person responsible for ensuring the plans' implementation.  |
