SUBJECT: REPORT - STUDENT VOTER REGISTRATION

STRATEGIC PLANNING GOAL: II - STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT/PREPARATION FOR POST SECONDARY EXPERIENCES

Each year, beginning with the 1972-73 school year, the Division of Social Sciences/Special Programs has coordinated student voter registration in the district's senior high schools. This activity is the direct result of the School Board's commitment to citizenship education.

Eligible students are registered to vote by Miami-Dade County Public Schools social studies teachers through their American Government and Economics classes. Materials, supplies, and general support are provided by the Miami-Dade County Elections Department. Outside groups such as the League of Women Voters of Miami-Dade County and Kids Voting, USA, continue to assist the school district in the area of voter education. In addition, all 27 adult centers provide information related to voter registration, as requested by students.

In order to register to vote in 1998-1999, students must have been at least 17 years of age as of May 14, 1999, citizens of the United States, residents of Miami-Dade County, and have no felony record. Other factors which may limit the number of students registering include: prior registration, religious conviction, and transfer/withdrawal from school. Each school's voter registration report is validated by the principal's signature.

The total number of students who registered to vote during the 1998-1999 school year was 9,638. Since the 1972-73 school year, 175,398 students have been registered to vote. This year, and each year since the 1995-96 school year, every senior high school in the district has achieved the goal of 100% voter registration of eligible students.

Attached is a compilation of the number of senior high school students who have registered to vote since the 1972-73 school year. In addition to the results for the 1998-99 school year, information is given regarding the student voter registration percentage for the previous year.

**RECOMMENDED:** That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, receive the 1998-99 Student Voter Registration Report.
