SUBJECT: REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING UNDER THE EISENHOWER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, TITLE II OF THE IMPROVING AMERICA'S SCHOOLS ACT, 1994,

JULY 1, 1999 - JULY 31, 2000

## STRATEGIC PLANNING GOAL: VIII - PROFESSIONAL STAFF AND PRACTICES

Under the Improving America's School Act of 1994, Title II was reauthorized as the Eisenhower Professional Development Program (EPDP) for the purpose of providing teacher education programs designed to improve teaching and learning in the areas of mathematics and science. In addition to the priority areas of mathematics and science, the Florida Department of Education received a waiver which permits EPDP funds to be expended in the other core academic subject areas, i.e., social studies and language arts. The Office of Professional Development and Career Advancement has prepared an application for the 1999-2000 school year to be used for:

- 1. teacher education in the core curriculum areas of mathematics, science, language arts, and social studies to improve the teaching and learning of all students; and
- 2. professional development and recruitment activities to increase the number of teachers from under-represented groups teaching in the core curriculum areas.

The funds allocated for teacher education will provide professional development activities for eligible teachers from Miami-Dade County Public Schools and participating non-public schools. In accordance with EPDP program guidelines for 1999-2000, 80 percent of the funds will be used to provide professional development activities as requested by the schools and 20 percent will be used for professional development activities offered at the district level.

Recruitment activities will be implemented by the Office of Human Resources and will include recruitment trips by multi-ethnic recruiting teams to colleges and universities with large enrollments of minority students, as well as a recruitment campaign with materials and presentations targeted for identified groups.

Funds in the amount of \$2,062,189 will be used for salary, reimbursement costs for teachers, contracted services, travel, printing and duplicating, supplies and equipment.

No local funds are required.

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RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$2,062,189, for funding under the Eisenhower Professional Development Program, Title II of the Improving America's Schools Act, 1994, July 1, 1999 July 31, 2000; and
- 2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency, such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
