REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING THE NEW MILLENNIUM HIGH SCHOOLS PROJECT, REIMBURSABLE COST PERIOD, JULY 1, 1999 - JUNE 30, 2000

In 1999, the Florida Department of Education issued a Request for Proposals to promote the implementation of the Florida Tech Prep Pathway (FTPP) Certificate Program in ten high schools throughout the state. William H. Turner Technical Arts High School was one of the centers chosen through a competitive process to receive the New Millennium High Schools grant.

Graduates who earn the FTPP certificate are well-prepared to continue their education in post-secondary institutions, while also possessing skills, knowledge, and attitudes which ensure success in today's technologically competitive workforce. Issuance of the certificate requires attainment of high academic standards in conjunction with career preparation. The latter requisites involve completing an industry-certified technical program and core technology course of study, taking part in a four-year career guidance program, participating in a work-based learning experience, and articulating with post-secondary institutions of learning.

Funds, in the amount of \$199,433, will be used for salaries, contracted services, printing, supplies, equipment, software, and membership fees to professional organizations.

Official notification relative to this grant award was received on December 6, 1999, which is after the start of the budget period. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from July 1, 1999.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED:

That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$199,433, for funding the New Millennium High Schools Project, reimbursable cost period, July 1, 1999 - June 30, 2000; and
- 2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
