SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM AND ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH JOBS FOR FLORIDA'S GRADUATES, FOR CONTINUATION FUNDING WITH THE REIMBURSABLE COST PERIOD, JANUARY 1, 2000 - JUNE 30, 2000

Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) was invited to participate as a state pilot site for the Jobs for Florida's Graduates (JFG) Program. JFG is a division of the Jobs for America's Graduates, a national initiative whose purpose is to work with students in grades 8-12 to provide them with the employability skills needed to enter the workplace. The Department of School Improvement and School-To-Career Initiatives in the Bureau of Elementary, Secondary, and Workforce Development Education is responsible for coordinating the project and for overseeing its implementation. During the 1998-99 pilot year, JFG targeted high school seniors for an 18-month Senior Program. Miami Jackson Senior High School and Miami Springs Senior High School were targeted because of their high-risk student clusters within their general populations. JFG is now in the second year of operation in the two pilot school sites.

JFG seeks to expand the program within M-DCPS by adding ten additional job specialist positions. Positions will be established under the grant program at the following schools: American (1), Barbara Goleman (2), Hialeah (1), Miami Central (1), Miami Edison (2), Miami Jackson (1), Miami Springs (1), and Miami Norland (1) Senior High Schools. The schools were selected for program participation because they were designated Level 2 or less by the Florida System of School Improvement and Accountability, the statewide grading system for school performance. Each school will target up to 50 at-risk students for participation in the JFG program.

The job specialists will provide students with classroom instruction in employability skills and will secure employment opportunities for the targeted students. Additionally, the job specialists are responsible for entering data into the state's tracking system for JFG graduates and for tracking the job placement and progress of the students during the 18 months after graduation.

Funds requested, in the amount of \$250,000, will cover the partial (6 months) salaries for the job specialists, travel, student transportation, and supplies.

Official notification relative to this grant award was received on December 17, 1999. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from January 1, 2000.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- accept a grant award from and enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with Jobs for Florida's Graduates, for continuation funding, in the amount of \$250,000, with the reimbursable cost period, January 1, 2000 - June 30, 2000; and
- 2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
