REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE BELLSOUTH FOUNDATION FOR FUNDING THE POWER TO TEACH GRANT PROGRAM, REIMBURSABLE COST PERIOD, NOVEMBER 12, 1999 – FEBRUARY 28, 2002

Booker T. Washington Senior High School has been awarded a grant, in the amount of \$150,000, from the BellSouth Foundation. The purpose of this award is to explore effective ways to provide the teachers of Booker T. Washington Senior High School with quality professional development experiences for integrating technology into the curriculum to enhance student performance. All schools and district offices were invited to participate in this grant initiative via the Federal Programs and Grants Administration website.

Grant funds, in the amount of \$150,000, will be used to cover supplies, materials, contracted services, equipment, and substitute teachers.

Official notification relative to this grant award was received on December 16, 1999, which is after the start of the budget period. The budget period for this award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from November 12, 1999.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- accept a grant award from the BellSouth Foundation, in the amount of \$150,000, for funding the Power to Teach Grant Program, reimbursable cost period, November 12, 1999 – February 28, 2002; and
- Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
